DVD

*Laurie Marcella, Mary Warmbrod and Holly Puckall of the Network have been working for 3 years on a dvd project. They received funding from the Attachment Network, Winnipeg Foundation, Children's Hospital Foundation, Healthy Child Manitoba, and CFS East Area Council, and with the help of people from Red River College, have produced a dvd entitled Listening to Baby. It is believed that no other dvd exists like this, and it is useful for practitioners to watch to learn about attachment, and to show a family to begin to discuss what attachment is. This is the "world premiere", and we got to watch parts of the dvd. There will be a formal launch sometime soon. The Network will be profiting from the sale of the dvd, and all funding agencies will receive free copies, including 150 copies to Healthy Child for use in their programs across Manitoba.

*The Network is preparing to establish a website and are entering into a contract with a distribution company which will enable us to sell the dvd

through the website. Unfortunately the contract precludes direct selling of the dvd, but it will be available shortly for \$39.95 plus shipping and handling. When the website is ready and the dvd can be purchased, all Network members will be notified by email.

Sub Committees

*Toddler Programming- Laurie struck a group at our last Network meeting to look into creating an ongoing drop in program for parents of toddlers to enable them to receive support and encouragement as their toddler goes through various changes. Their next meeting is Sept 20.

*Executive Committee--this is the new name for the Steering Committee as a strategic planning day in the spring highlighted the need to move to a more formal structure. They are establishing terms of reference, and looking eventually to incorporating. There has been interest (and envy) expressed by practitioners in Alberta about our Network, and so we are now the Attachment Network of Manitoba.

*Education, Training and Research--We have been, or will soon be treated to the giants in attachment literature (Marvin, Boris, Crittenden) and feel that we need to create made in Manitoba research about the wonderful work we are doing here. *Changes for Children--The gov't is reviewing the child welfare system and the Network has been invited to submit around the differential response. The group has prepared a draft of a document that will hopefully be presented soon. We are suggesting that all intake staff and supervisors be trained in attachment assessments as per Pat Crittenden's 3 minute CARE Index models. This will also help with determining risk.

*How to meld Triple P and Attachment---They do go hand in hand, depending on the assessment. Triple P can be the teaching component in MIG as well.

*Daniel Hughes--Mary made contact with him about coming to Winnipeg. He is an expert on attachment with families who foster and adopt.

*refugee and immigrant families, and in fact, Aboriginal families who come from remote communities to Winnipeg.
